

**Grammar point: 文法**

In this episode, Dean said, “We’ve got to seize the moment and remember what we have right now. The day might come when we’ll miss it here.” In English, we often use “may” and “might” to indicate possibility. Examples are given below to show the difference between “may” and “might.”

“May” is often used to ask for permission (e.g., May I borrow your pen?) while it can also be used to indicate possibility (e.g., It may rain tomorrow).

Might is used to indicate possibility. For example, “She might come to the party tonight.” While both ‘may’ and ‘might’ can indicate possibility, we use ‘might’ to suggest smaller possibility than ‘may.’
