1. Today we are going to pinpoint the focus of our presentation.

The speaker means that we are to decide exactly what main points our presentation will cover.

- 2. Aboriginals do not draw a line of difference between "yours" and "mine."

 Sometimes you can simply say "draw a line between A and B, " and it means the same as drawing a line of difference between A and B, that is, to separate and distinguish A and B.
- 3. We use "used to + V" for something that happened regularly in the past but no longer happens. For example, "I used to drive to work but now I take the bus."
 Be careful not to confuse "used to + V" with "to be used to + V-ing". The latter refers to something that is normal and ordinary, not unusual at all. For instance, "I have lived in Britain for a couple of years, so I am used to driving on the left."
