Grammar point: 文法

1. Today we are going to pinpoint the focus of our presentation.

The speaker means that we are to decide exactly what main points our presentation will cover.

2. Aboriginals do not draw a line of difference between “yours” and “mine.”
Sometimes you can simply say “draw a line between A and B, ” and it means the same as drawing a line of difference between A and B, that is, to separate and distinguish A and B.

3. We use "used to + V" for something that happened regularly in the past but no longer happens. For example, “I used to drive to work but now I take the bus.”
Be careful not to confuse "used to + V" with "to be used to + V-ing". The latter refers to something that is normal and ordinary, not unusual at all. For instance, “I have lived in Britain for a couple of years, so I am used to driving on the left.”
