Vocabulary 圖解詞語

1. throw (v.): to toss or hurl with great force

例句：I will throw the ball to Jenny, and she will score for our team.

	throw on (v.)	throw a party
throw (n.)	throw (v.)	throw the blame on
	throw up (v.)	throw oneself into

Throw can also mean “to put (suddenly) into a condition or activity.”

throw a party: to plan and carry out a party

例句：His daughter threw a surprise party for his fiftieth birthday.

When one throws the blame on someone else, or throws himself into something, that means he is directing the blame to or himself into something.

例句：Jerry threw the blame on his little brother after he was punished.

例句：He threw himself into his work after his girlfriend left him.

throw on: to put on carelessly or hastily

例句：Alice throws on a dress at the last minute before rushing out for the party.

throw up (v.): to vomit

例句：My little boy threw up after he got seriously carsick.

throw (n.): the act of throwing

例句：Let's give this new baseball a throw! (Note: This is to be used on informal occasions.)

2. cater (v.): to provide food service for an event.

例句：Let's not tire ourselves and cook everything this Christmas; I'll ask to have refreshments catered for us.

caterer (n.)	cater (v.)	
	cater to (v.)	

To cater to someone's needs means to provide help or subject oneself to suit someone else's needs.

例句：This TV channel specially caters to housewives.

caterer (n.): someone who provides the food services, or someone who caters

例句：She works as a caterer.

3. green light (n.): a signal for "go"

例句：Please do not walk until you see the green light.

	green light (n.)	
	give the green light (to)	

“To give the green light” is an expression for someone to allow something to happen.

例句: The teacher has given the green light to the proposed group project for this class.

4. accompany (v.): to go with or be with. In music, to accompany means to play a musical instrument with another musical performer.

例句: He will be accompanying me to the dance for tomorrow night.

例句: I'll play the violin, but you have to accompany me on the piano.

companion (n.)		accommodate (v.)

company (n.): an association with one another; a fellowship

例句: I enjoy her company very much.

companion (n.): one that accompanies another.

例句: Dogs are close companions of man.

accommodate (v.) – to make fit or bring into agreement

例句: They were nice enough to accommodate my father with a plane ticket back to Taiwan.

5. theme (n.): a central idea or topic. A theme party is a party organized around a particular theme or idea; decorations, music, and activities at a theme party relate to the chosen theme.

例句: Every novel or movie must have a central theme.

	theme song	

theme song: a song played several times in a movie

例句: "Tonight" is the theme song of *West Side Story*.

6. slogan (n.): a phrase that expresses the special qualities or goals of a person, a group, or an organization

例句: A slogan might be identified with a political candidate, a club, or a business.
